

PENTECOST SUNDAY MAY 19, 2024

Notes from the Pastor

MEMORIAL DAY MASS: On Monday, May 27, at 10:00am, we will celebrate Mass in the chapel at St. Thomas Cemetery. All are welcome to attend.

<u>PENTECOST SUNDAY</u>: As we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, an old tradition is to look at the Fruits of the Holy Spirit and to pick one to pray for in the week ahead. Maybe there is a particular Fruit of the Holy Spirit that you need at this point in your life, or one you have difficulty with and need help from the Holy Spirit to live that Fruit of the Spirit more often in your life.

LOVE: We exhibit the virtue of charity, or love, by our unselfish devotion and care for God and our neighbor. Love is seeking the good of another, even at our own expense. We might be willing to sacrifice our time, money, or labor in order to help another person.

JOY: We live with joy when we recognize that true happiness comes, not from money or possessions, but from knowing and following Christ. Joy also is displayed when we experience hardship or difficulty, ridicule or injustice, and yet do not hate the person inflicting it upon us. Joy is transforming the negative things that come our way into positive things.

PEACE: We are freed from worrying about trivial things because of the inner peace we experience with God in our hearts. We work and pray for peace throughout the world. This peace results from trying to align our will with God's will.

PATIENCE: We demonstrate patience by treating others with thoughtfulness and tolerance. We resist the urge to condemn others and exercise all options to forgive them and bring healing to their lives. It may involve enduring ingratitude, indifference and contempt as Jesus did, rather than responding with anger.

KINDNESS: We live the virtue of kindness by treating others as we want to be treated. Jesus taught us to love our enemies, as well as those who are king to us. The real test of kindness is when we can extend it to those who do not treat us with kindness. Kindness is a tender-hearted concern for others.

GOODNESS (**GENEROSITY**): We demonstrate the fruit of generosity when we share our gifts and possessions with others. The true test of generosity is when we are willing to offer our gifts and possessions even before others ask for our assistance.

FAITHFULNESS: We are faithful when we live out our commitment to the teachings of Jesus, the Scriptures, and the Catholic Church. Our faithfulness must mirror the faithfulness of God. Remember how God remains faithful to us even when we turn away from God in our sin. We refuse to waver from the truth no matter what happens to us.

GENTLENESS: Gentle people act calmly and avoid actions that might lead others to anger or resentment. Gentleness results from sensitivity to the delicate nature of life; like a good mother's caring protection, there should be no abrupt or forceful movements, no pushing, no arguing, no manipulation.

SELF-CONTROL: If athletes can exercise discipline — or self-control — in order to achieve something that is purely frivolous, Christians should be able to exercise self-control in order to achieve something of the highest and most meaningful value. This self-control is a restraint on our tendency to pursue our own satisfaction, without any consideration for the good of others.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR NEXT YEAR: We are preparing to combine the Religious Education Program for this coming year. The number of students we have does not merit having two separate programs. You may have noticed that last week, St. Thomas had one student make her first communion and St. Teresa had two students make theirs. Combining our resources will help to make our program stronger.

We met with parents to explain the plan. The plan is to have classes at St. Teresa for the first half of the year and at St. Thomas for the second half of the year.

This will also constitute a change in Mass times. We will continue to alternate the Saturday Mass at 4:30pm each month. On Sunday morning Mass will be at St. Thomas at 8:00am and at St. Teresa at 11:00am. Religious Education will be held in between those two Sunday morning Masses. On those Sundays where Religious Education is at St. Teresa class will begin at 9:30am and go until 10:45am. This will enable people who go to 8:00am Mass at St. Thomas to get to class at St. Teresa and enable those who go to class to be finished in time for Mass at St. Teresa. And when Religious Education is at St. Thomas, class will begin at 9:00am and finish at 10:30am in order for people to get back to St. Teresa for Mass.



Why is it called Pentecost?

The feast is celebrated on the 50th and final day of the Easter season. The Greek word "pentekoste" means "fiftieth."

Why is Pentecost known as the birthday of the Church?

When the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples, they immediately began proclaiming the Gospel. In fact, three thousand people were baptized that day. The disciples, through the gift of the Holy Spirit, were answering Jesus' call to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). The Holy Spirit is vital in the mission and witness of the Church, so we consider Pentecost the birthday of the Church.

Continued—Notes from the Pastor:
