



Notes from the Pastor

<u>REMINDERS ABOUT PARISH PROCEDURES</u>: We have some procedures in place that help us to make sure things run smoothly. Just a few reminders about some of those:

- FUNERALS: The first point of contact when someone dies is the funeral home. The funeral home will then contact the pastor and the parish office. All the funeral homes have a copy of the funeral planning booklet that we use at St. Thomas and St. Teresa. This booklet is also on our parish website. It has the readings you can choose from and the songs that can be chosen.
- **FUNERAL DINNERS**: Again, the first point of contact is the funeral home. The funeral home will then contact the office or the pastor to check on availability of the hall, if the funeral dinner is being held at St. Thomas or St. Teresa. The office or the pastor will contact the person in charge of funeral dinners.
- **USE OF PARISH BUILDINGS**: All organizations need to contact the parish office to arrange for meetings to be held in parish buildings. Those desiring to use the parish buildings for an event need to schedule that with the parish office. We have a variety of groups and rentals using the buildings that need to be coordinated by one person.
- MONEY SECURITY: All fund-raising events need to follow diocesan policy in regard to securing money for your event and for counting and securing the money after the event. Money from fund raising events should never be kept at someone's home, nor should money be sent to someone's home. All money should be turned in to the parish office or placed in envelopes in the collection basket.

UPCOMING EVENTS:

• ANOINTING OF THE SICK: After all the Masses on the weekend of June 28/29, we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: A brief review of the sacrament and those who are eligible to receive it may be needed. This sacrament is meant to help a person cope with their illness and confront the limitations that being human imposes on our souls: our hopes, our dreams, our desire to be meaningful. Sickness does not just affect our bodies but also our spirits and our attitudes. It is intended to heal the anguish of the soul.

" 'Anointing of the Sick,' is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for that person to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived." (Constitution on the Liturgy, Vatican Council II)

What might constitute "in danger of death from sickness or old age (serious illness)? Or who is eligible to receive the sacrament?

- A person who becomes ill and the illness becomes more serious;
- A person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery;
- Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present;
- Sick children are to be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament. In a case of doubt



- Some types of mental illness are now classified as serious. Those who are judged to have a serious mental illness and who would be strengthened by the sacrament may be anointed (depression, paranoia, etc...);
- In case of doubt as to whether the illness is serious or not, the person should be anointed.

Time to Return the LifeCare Baby Bottles


