

Message from the Pastor

ASH WEDNESDAY: Due to my surgery being pushed back a week, we will have a service of the Word with distribution of ashes at the following times on Ash Wednesday: 8:00am at St. Thomas, distribution of ashes at both churches at Noon, and 7:00pm at St. Teresa.

THE WORD AMONG US BOOKLETS: People seem to like these booklets, and we are continuing to purchase them for people from our parish. The Rosary Societies from each parish have been underwriting the cost of these booklets. These booklets are intended for individual people of our parish. We hope that you continue to find them as a source of prayer and growth in your relationship with God.

ISSUE: We usually purchase enough booklets for those who want to use them. Recently, we seem to have someone taking large numbers of these booklets from St. Thomas to use at another location. Hence there are not enough for our parishioners who want them. This person needs to purchase the books for their purpose and not take ours. I might remind this person what you are doing is stealing. If the issue persists, we will find other ways to distribute the booklets to our parishioners.

HEALTH UPDATE: Two years ago, I announced that I would be greeting people at the doors before and after Mass, but that I would NOT be shaking people's hands. I did this because I am immune suppressed and didn't want to take unnecessary risks and not pass those on to others. Most people have been very gracious in cooperating with my request to NOT shake hands (fist bump or anything else). I ask for your continued diligence with that as cold and flu season is in full swing.

As some of you may know, I have been experiencing some health issues since August. After months of tests and doctor appointments, I am having surgery to resolve my issues. My surgery will be early in February and will entail some "down time" on my part including not being able to drive for two weeks. I will be able to walk to Mass at St. Teresa but will not be able to drive to St. Thomas for those two weeks. Fr. Leo Gallina and Fr. Tom Suppa will cover the weekend Masses for me on those two weekends.

CONTACT INFORMATION: All business should be conducted through the office at St. Thomas in Corry. Please check the bulletin for office hours. The office is not open on Friday, Saturday or Sunday. Recently, people have been showing up at St. Teresa to use the building without having contacted the parish office. The first point of contact for all parish related business is the office in Corry 814-663-3041.

When a parishioner is in the hospital, please call the parish office (814-663-3041) to let us know so someone can visit them and provide them with communion and/or the anointing of the sick. The same is true if someone is in the nursing home – particularly the Corry Manor. I visit the Manor each month to anoint the Catholic residents and one of our Eucharistic Ministers takes communion there each month as well.

In case of someone needing to be anointed you can call the parish office (814-663-3041) or the number at the rectory at St. Teresa is 814-438-6048. Remember that I live at St. Teresa but am in the office at St. Thomas part of the week. Don't be afraid to leave messages at both places for me. It is hard to be in two places at one time.



Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

AI-generated Explicit Images. With the rising use of AI, explicit nonconsensual images can be generated easily and without the victim's knowledge. An offender may not even need an explicit image to work from. When threatened with explicit AI-generated images being published or distributed online, victims often succumb to demands for money, in-person meetings or worse. This can affect anyone, regardless of age or gender—but children are most at risk. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children provides a free service called, "Take It Down," that can help one remove or stop the online sharing of nude, partially nude, or sexually explicit images or videos of minors.
