

Notes from the Pastor

<u>CONTACT INFORMATION</u>: Since I live at one parish and the parish office is at another, it can be sometimes tricky to get in contact with me. Most weeks, I am in the office at St. Thomas on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. The number there is 814-663-3041. Thursday is usually my day off. I am at St. Teresa on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. The number at St. Teresa is 814-438-6048. Always leave a message. There is an emergency contact number when you call St. Thomas and listen to all the options.

<u>PARKING SPACES</u>: There are many times when people park in the NO PARKING zones. We ask that you refrain from doing this as it creates serious issues in emergency situations. Also, at St. Teresa we have just finished paving the parking lot and drawing lines for parking spaces. If there are no lines then, there is no parking in that area. The only exception to that is for handicap parking at the very front of the Church.

HOSPITAL VISITS: If you have a family member in the hospital and would like the priest or deacon to come and visit, please call the parish office to let us know what room and what hospital the patient is in. Both Hamot and St. Vincent have a local priest on call, you can simply ask the nurse and he or she can help you make that contact.

<u>CONFIRMATION STUDENTS</u>: Just a reminder to all of those who were recently confirmed. In my interview with each of you, I gave you a form that listed a number of ministry opportunities. If you are interested in any of these ministries, please return that form to Mrs. Silka, Deacon Randy, the parish office, or Fr. Tom so we can begin the training to get you started in that ministry. If you lost the form, I will have extras at Mass each weekend.

RETURNING TO THE PARISH: We have noticed a number of people that have been returning to the parish in recent months. We are most grateful to have you back. Please take a moment to introduce yourselves to Fr. Tom. You might also want to be sure that you are registered at the parish so that you receive communication about events at the parish. You can complete the form on the front of the bulletin, or you can go on the parish website and click the tab, "I'm New" and the registration form will be there.

LAWN FESTIVAL AT ST. TERESA: Mark you calendars for July 18 when St. Teresa Parish will be hosting their annual Lawn Festival. 

This Year's Missionary Cooperative Collection—July 27/28

This special second collection will be <u>taken up in our parishes the</u> <u>weekend of July 27/28</u> when we will have a visit from a member of the Hospitaler Sisters of Mercy. They will be here at our parishes to share their ministry. Here is a little background on their congregation:

The Hospitaler Sisters of Mercy

The Hospitaler Sisters of Mercy (SOM) are an international order of Catholic religious women. We completely consecrate our lives to the love and glory of God. Our lives are dedicated to the Works of Mercy through a vow of Hospitality. Our life is animated by the spirit of charity, especially for those who are sick, suffering or in need.

Our Sisters minister to the poor, the ill, and the suffering. We provide care to the disenfranchised, neglected and abused, to anyone in need of God's love and mercy through acts of service and evangelization. We have established and operate nearly 70 missions in 13 countries. Through the dedication of our approximately 400 Sisters who represent 11 various nationalities, we continue to expand our mission locations to help meet the needs of God's people.

In the United States, our sisters are in New Jersey, South Carolina, and Louisiana. We minister to the disabled and elderly at Villa Raffaella Assisted Living Community in Pleasantville, NJ, and at Carter House in South Carolina. In Louisiana we operate Mother of Mercy Retreat as well as working with child victims of human trafficking through Metanoia Manor.

Their Charism:

To Embrace, Live, and Transmit the Mercy of God, in every situation of life through the vow of Hospitality."

We carry out this Mission of Mercy primarily by caring for the sick, the poor and the suffering through our ministry in service to the marginalized and poor People of God through health care and socioeconomic programs, education development, and faith formations. Christ's love is preached through our humble services and promising mission work.

New Look to Our Religious Education Program

Our Religious Education Program will combine this coming year. The number of students does not merit having two separate programs.



Combining our resources will help to make our program stronger. This Fall for the 2024-2025 Religious Education Year, we will have classes at St. Teresa for the first half of the year (September—December) and at St. Thomas for the second half of the year (January—May).

This will also constitute a change in Mass times. We will continue to alternate the Saturday Mass at 4:30pm each month. On Sunday morning Mass will be at St. Thomas at 8:00am and at St. Teresa at 11:00am. Religious Education will be held in between those two Sunday morning Masses. On those Sundays where Religious Education is at St. Teresa class will be from 9:30am—10:45am. This will enable people who go to 8:00am Mass at St. Thomas to get to class at St. Teresa and enable those who go to class to be finished in time for Mass at St. Teresa. And when class is at St. Thomas, class will be 9:00am—10:30am in order for people to get back to St. Teresa for Mass.

It will be a change in the way things are done, but it will enable us to use our resources more efficiently. We are always looking for help with Religious Education, so do not be afraid to volunteer to teach, or be an aide, or to help with some other aspect of the program. If interested in helping, please reach out to Missy Silka. Families with school-aged children should be on the lookout for registration information over the summer.
