



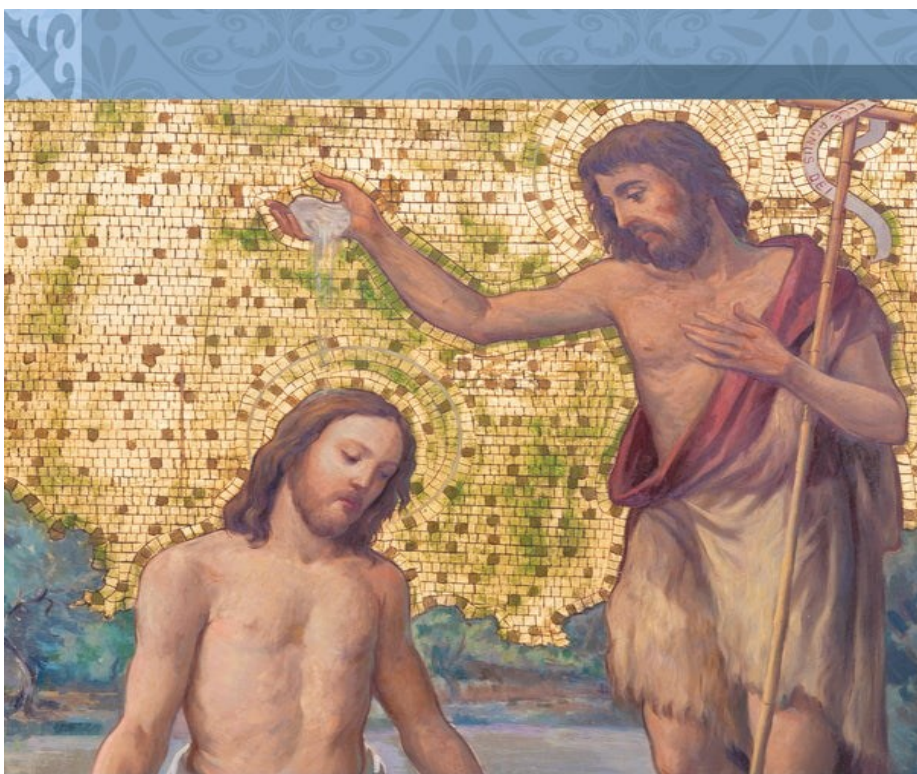

Message from the Pastor

CHRISTMAS GIFTS THANK YOU LETTER: Many of you were so generous as to participate in our giving tree at St. Teresa to support families connected to Safe Journey in Union City. We received a very nice thank you letter from them and I have posted it in the back of the church. Part of the letter reads: "Many of the individuals and families we support have experienced fear, isolation, and hardship. Because of you, parents were able to watch their children open gifts with joy, and families felt a sense of warmth and dignity during a season that can be especially difficult. Several shared how grateful they were and how hard it was to believe that people they may never meet cared enough to think of them and support them during this time."

The full letter is posted in the back of the church and is worth reading to know how much your kindness and generosity was appreciated.

HEALTH UPDATE: Two years ago, I announced that I would be greeting people at the doors before and after Mass, but that I would NOT be shaking people's hands. I did this because I am immune suppressed and didn't want to take unnecessary risks and not pass those on to others. Most people have been very gracious in cooperating with my request to NOT shake hands (fist bump or anything else). I ask for your continued diligence with that as cold and flu season is in full swing.

As some of you may know, I have been experiencing some health issues since August. After months of tests and doctor appointments, I am having surgery to resolve my issues. My surgery will be early in February and will entail some "down time" on my part including not being able to drive for two weeks. I will be able to walk to Mass at St. Teresa but will not be able to drive to St. Thomas for those two weeks. Father Leo Gallina and Fr. Tom Suppa will cover the weekend Masses for me on those two weekends.

LITTLE BLACK BOOKS: I have placed a few copies of what are called "little black books" for Lent in the back of both Churches. Please feel free to take these and use them for Lent. Please let me know if you think these are worth investing in for the future. We are giving the Religious Education Students a little purple book for Lent and have given our First Eucharist Students little books on the Eucharist.

Where do these come from? Many years ago, Bishop Ken Untener, from Saginaw, Michigan started these "little books" in his diocese. Bishop Untener was an amazing individual in many ways before his death in 2004. He gave a retreat to some of the priests of the diocese of Erie that I was privileged to be a part of. Some people from the Saginaw Diocese have continued his work with these "little books."

CONTACT INFORMATION: When a parishioner is in the hospital, please call the parish office (814-663-3041) to let us know so someone can visit them and provide them with communion and/or the anointing of the sick. The same is true if someone is in the nursing home – particularly the Corry Manor. I visit the Manor each month to anoint the Catholic residents and one of our Eucharistic Ministers takes communion there each month as well.

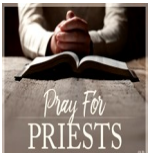

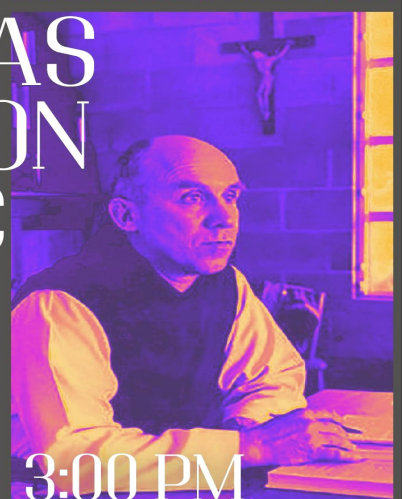

### Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

**January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month.** In 2024, the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children received over 27,800 reports of possible child sex trafficking. The average age of child sex trafficking victims is 15 years old. Child sex trafficking is child abuse. It occurs when a minor is advertised, solicited, or exploited through a commercial sex act where sex is exchanged for money, food, shelter, drugs, or anything of value. Traffickers can be family members (even parents), friends, gangs, foster parents, trusted adults or boyfriends. Talk openly with your child about this reality and build resiliency. Address myths that glamorize the commercial sex industry. Warn about online risks: social media and gaming platforms are used by traffickers to target, groom, and recruit victims. Prepare your child: at some point they will likely encounter inappropriate messages or harmful content online. Teach them how to respond safely. Report suspected child sex trafficking by calling 1-800-843-5678 or visit [CyberTipline.org](http://CyberTipline.org).
