

Notes from the Pastor

<u>CONFIRMATION</u>: Last week we had a number of our young people receive the sacrament of confirmation at St. Francis Xavier Church in McKean. It was a wonderful celebration, and our young people are to be commended for their hard work and service in preparation for the sacrament, as well as how they conducted themselves during the ceremony.

We also need to thank Deacon Kondrlik, his wife Anne, Shelley Tomcho, and Missy Silka for all their work in teaching the classes and coordinating all the activities and details that go into this program and the ceremony itself.

COORDINATION OF ACTIVITIES: I ask that all activities be coordinated through the parish office. At various times we have had people just show up to do something and another group has already scheduled an event. At other times we have engaged someone to do work on the property and someone else has scheduled this work to be done. At other times people just do things on the church or cemetery property that they do not have permission to do. At other times people at the last minute decide to do something, and there is already something else scheduled. We need to do a better job of coordinating activities, as individuals and as organizations, through the pastor and the parish office.

<u>FASTING BEFORE COMMUNION</u>: There was a time when people had to fast from all food and drink from midnight until they received communion. Those fasting rules have been relaxed but not eliminated. We are asked to fast from all food, including gum, and drink for one hour before receiving communion. The only exceptions are water and medicine. Those who are ill or in the hospital do not have to follow the fast.

<u>COMMUNION</u>: I have noticed there are a number of inconsistencies in how this happens. Allow me to offer some clarity, hopefully.

First of all, if you choose to receive the Precious Blood from one of the cups, you are to take the cup in your hands and drink from the cup. Typically, people take a small sip. IT IS NEVER PERMITTED TO TAKE THE HOST AND DIP THE HOST INTO THE WINE. The minister of the Eucharist should cover the cup and instruct you to please consume the host first and then consume the wine.

If you choose to receive communion on the tongue, the minister of the Eucharist will say "the Body of Christ," and you will respond by saying, "Amen." Then you should lean your head back open your mouth wide and extend your tongue. The minister of the Eucharist will place the host on your tongue. You should not try to bite the host out of the hand of the minister of the Eucharist. The host is placed on your tongue.

St. Cyril of Jerusalem in the fourth century offered a beautiful and powerful catechesis on the mode of receiving communion in the hand that is still applicable today: "When you approach, do not go stretching out your open hands or having your fingers spread out, but make the left hand into a throne for the right which shall receive the King, and then holding in your open hand the Body of Christ, reciting the 'Amen.'

saying, "Amen." If you are right-handed, then your left hand should be extended to be flat and your right hand should be underneath your left hand. The host will be placed in the palm of your hand. You should take the host with your right hand and place it in your mouth. (The opposite is true if you are left handed.) Please do not grab the host from the minister of the Eucharist. Allow the minister of the Eucharist to place the host in your hand and wait until the minister's hand is out of the way before you reach to take the host in your hand to consume it. Please make sure your hand is flat, not cupped. Please make sure that one hand is underneath the other, not side by side. We do not eat the host out of the palm of our hand, but we pick up the host and place it in our mouth.



Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Stay Safe While Gaming Online. Online gaming can be lots of fun and pretty cool to compete against people from every corner of the world. Gaming can also expose your child to dangers such as cyber bullying, online harassment, and online predators. Here are some helpful tips to teach your children to ensure they are being safe while gaming. 1. Never give your identity. When creating an account, use a nickname. When creating an avatar, don't use your real picture.

2. Do not give out any personal information including phone numbers, addresses, where you go to school, and especially your age. Predators pretend to be teenagers and will talk to your child until your child feels they are safe to talk to about personal stuff. 3. Have your child mute conversations. People say mean things to one another and it's best to prevent the risk of bullying or trash talking online. 4. Block anyone who makes you feel uncomfortable. 5. New Look to Our Religious Education Program

Our Religious Education Program will combine this coming year. The number of students does not merit having two separate programs. Combining

our resources will help to make our program stronger. This Fall for the 2024-2025 Religious Education Year, we will have classes at St. Teresa for the first half of the year (September—December) and at St. Thomas for the second half of the year (January—May).

This will also constitute a change in Mass times. We will continue to alternate the Saturday Mass at 4:30pm each month. On Sunday morning Mass will be at St. Thomas at 8:00am and at St. Teresa at 11:00am. Religious Education will be held in between those two Sunday morning Masses. On those Sundays where Religious Education is at St. Teresa class will be from 9:30am—10:45am. This will enable people who go to 8:00am Mass at St. Thomas to get to class at St. Teresa and enable those who go to class to be finished in time for Mass at St. Teresa. And when class is at St. Thomas, class will be 9:00am—10:30am in order for people to get back to St. Teresa for Mass.

Families with school-aged children should be on the lookout for registration information over the summer.
